A cause of death Register for the Flatcoated Retriever has been set up by Cambridge Veterinary School. Dr. Jane Dobson thinks it best that data is entered as dogs die from now rather than historically, the results will be more robust this way. Flatcoated Retriever Cause of Death Survey

For many years owners and breeders of Flatcoated Retrievers have worked with Cambridge Veterinary School to document and study the incidence of cancer in the breed. The results of a Health Study involving a cohort of 174 dogs conducted over 12 years were published in 2009; (Dobson and others, 2009) 42% of these dogs died from confirmed tumours but 35% of dogs died of non-tumour causes. Following on from this study and in conjunction with the breed Health Sub-Committee, we would like to continue to monitor the "health" of the breed by recording causes of death and have set up a website data base for this purpose. The information collected will be kept in strict confidence by Cambridge Veterinary School who will issue an annual, anonymised report to the Breed Health Committee. We believe that this is an innovative and effective way to monitor the health of the breed that may shed light on new or emerging problems and show trends in health issues.
